The Department of Mental Health of the Johns Hopkins University Bloomberg School of Public Health is searching for individuals for tenure-track positions at the level of Assistant or Associate Professor. The Department consists of 18 full-time faculty from diverse disciplines and about 75 research fellows and students. Our mission is to advance understanding of the occurrence, causes, and consequences of alcohol, drug, and mental disorders, to improve health in the general population, and to prevent and control these disorders and their consequences for functioning, disability, and health. Department faculty conduct a range of research in a multi-disciplinary environment, collaborating with other departments in the School of Public Health, with the Departments of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences and Pediatrics in the School of Medicine, and with a number of local and State agencies.

The Department seeks an individual with experience and dedication to the public health approach to addictions and substance use disorders. The recruit will have the potential to collaborate with a range of researchers in the School of Public Health and the School of Medicine. Preference will be given to candidates with substance abuse services research, epidemiology, and/or prevention expertise. An international orientation or experience is also an advantage. Applicants should have the M.D. degree or a doctoral degree in public health psychology, sociology, social work, or a related discipline. Faculty are expected to teach and to develop externally-funded research. Successful candidates will have a strong publication record or an exceptional potential to publish.

Review of applicants will begin in the fall of 2011 and will continue until the position is filled. Interested candidates should send a letter describing research and teaching interests, names and addresses of potential references, and a Curriculum Vita, to:
